And so as you review the letters you get from different departments, I hope you will distinguish between inadequacy as it relates -- inadequacy as it relates to performance, okay, and the shirking of duty as it relates to same and equal application of law. So I ask you to establish a standard amongst yourselves upon which to review these requested amendments, okay, so that the social contract will remain intact.

I would also ask you to look at the electoral districts. And at a certain stage, we'll start -- and, again, it's up to us when we decide when we're going to actually start saying this is debating on whether this amendment is going to get -- get into -- into the Council.

So with that said, we could discuss quickly ideas right now on how we are going to deal with the 1 itself, or by petition of citizens, you have this 2 Charter Commission review. So I put this on for 3 information purposes only. It may be a dual track at 4 the next election.

Charter amendments proposed by the Council, all it takes is two readings by resolution. Okay. Charter amendments proposed by the 2011 Charter Commission, then you got to go through this process.

Now, in addition to this one, establishing an Office of County Auditor, we recently got two more requests from the Council people. Just for your information, we haven't done it yet, but it's going to be done, Council is proposing to amend the Charter to have the Council approve the appointment of the Planning Director. Right now, he's just an appointment. The other one is review and approval and appointment of the Director of Finance. Review and approve. Unlike Corp Counsel's Office and prosecutors. They get grilled before they get into the job. So these are Council-initiated Charter amendments.

Now, hopefully, it doesn't come to a point where the Council has five amendments to amend the Charter, this Commission has 10 amendments to amend the Charter, and some of them conflict. Okay. Then we've got a problem. Then I think, you know, our office would

MR. KUSHI: Mr. Chair, Members, for clarification, I took the initiative to put this on your agenda. Let me clarify first. Back in early May, Council Services, through Councilmember Mike White's staff, requested that we draft a Charter amendment.

Now, in your packets, if you would look at the County Charter, the County Charter, it's at Page 49. If you can find that first. Article 14, Charter Amendment, as we read this and interpret it -- and so does the County Clerk -- there are various ways to amend the Charter. Section 14-1 says, by resolution of the Council adopted -- amendments to this Charter may be initiated only in the following manner: By resolution of the Council adopted after two readings on separate days and passed by vote of six members or more. And it goes on by petition and another by petition. So this is what Councilmember White has proposed to the Council; not to this Commission.

At the same time, hopefully at the same election, you go on to Page 50, Section 14-3, Mandatory Review, which establishes the appointment of this Charter Commission.

So in addition to proposals to amend the Charter from the Council people, from the Council 1 have to either advise this Commission or the Council, 2 have one question, two alternatives.

MEMBER BAXA: Mr. Chair?

CHAIR STONE: Yes, Commissioner Baxa. MEMBER BAXA: I was reading the Charter

6 itself, and I notice the conflict there. Not really a conflict, but two ways of amending the Charter; one by the Council and one by the Charter Commission. I found it odd that, at the period when there is a Charter Commission acting that the Council can still do that. That is what is set out.

I think, in my own mind, at the time when the Charter Commission meets, the Council should not be able to make a proposal to an amendment to the Charter. They could -- in my own mind, the best way to do that is, once the Charter acts, let the proposal made by the Charter be submitted to the people. They approve or disapprove. Then, at some point, if the Council wants to make amendment again, they can do so, but only after the expiration of the term of the Commission.

So at this point, I see it very odd that, at one point, two bodies can make amendments to the Charter. It does seem confusing to the people. MEMBER DEREGO: Can I make a comment on this

point as well?

I would see this more as a cooperative venture between the Council and the Charter Commission. There's a process involved that is supposed to occur every 10 years. And that within that process, the Council is supposed to be involved. Because we do send them a report, they do reply to it. If they have any additions or alternatives, that is part of the process.

his proposal for the auditor. And it didn't seem like he was -- had boiled it down to how this process would work, you know, like -- because he's a new Council member, he's like the first time out on the track.

And -- and I think it would be advantageous to write Mike and -- and those who initiated these other requests and suggest that they submit them to us and have -- have a process where, rather than necessarily have a competing process, is to -- to warmly and positively suggest that it be considered in this venue first and chewed on.
