Dear Mr. Nakasone, and Members of the Commission,

Thank you for your patience and willingness to consider by concerns regarding the survival of our democratic form of government, namely, my requests that the scope of Chapter 10 be extended to include actions taken by Boards and Commissions.

Again, I implore you to amend Article 10. The political dogma that asserts that where there is mass there is truth, has been an underlying premise of succeeding administrations of the County for more than a decade. Perhaps, the distrust and lack of faith in government's integrity can be traced to this idea.

My hope is that by amending the Article 10, the decision of a majority will in face be judged for its moral impact. It will be measured by standards articulated in this article for the purpose of preserving our democratic form of governance.

I have enclosed with this letter a copy of the Resolution I read to the Commission at it's December 5, 1991 meeting. I have revised it as you will note.

RESOLUTION

Introduced by JIM SMITH registered voter

WHERE AS, for the survival of government it is necessary that citizens justifiably have trust and confidence in the integrity of government;

WHERE AS, actions of the Board of Variance and Appeals, Maui Planning Commission, Board of Water Supply or any regulatory Board or Commission of the County of Maui may not justify trust and confidence in the integrity of government;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Maui County Charter Commission amend Article 10, Code of Ethic, Section 10 - 1, Declaration of Policy, to read: : Elected and appointed officers and employees, the Board of Variance and Appeals; Board of Water Supply; Maui Planning Commission; Liquor Control Adjudication Board and Police Commission shall demonstrate by their actions the highest standards of ethical conduct to the end that the public may justifiably have trust and confidence in the integrity of government."

FURTHER, be it resolved that Section 10 -4 (2) be amended to include: "No board or commission by its action shall cause a prudent registered voter to lose trust and confidence in the integrity of government.";

FURTHER, that Section 10 - 4 (2) be amended to include: "No agent of the Office of Corporation Counsel shall permit a Board or Commission to take action upon an incomplete application, upon a misrepresentation of material fact, or the intention or content of legislative directive, nor shall proceedings be held without the presence of a representative of the Office of Corporation Counsel.";

FURTHERMORE, that section 10 - 5 be amended to read: "Any Board or Commission of the County determined to have violated provisions of this article shall publish a description of its violation and an apology in all local daily, weekly and month newspapers, address to citizens of this community, and any other administrative remedy the Board of Ethics deems appropriate."

Re: Maui County Charter

Dear Paul:

Guy Haywood told me you are counsel for the Maui Charter Review Commission. I probably shouldn't get involved in County matters, because people may read too much into it. However, I have a couple of questions about the charter. I thought I'd bring them to your attention, so that you and the commissioners can consider them and do whatever seems warranted.


First Question: Geographic Residency Requirement

Q. Does the geographic residency requirement for eight of the nine council seats violate the requirements of Section 12-41, Haw. Rev. Stat.?

Example: the case of William Kinaka

In the 1990 primary election, William Kinaka received 7,990 votes in the primary election. This resulted in a fourth place finish among six candidates running for the three Central Maui seats, but was the ninth highest total of all council candidates in the Democratic Party Primary.

From the same electorate, Tom Morrow received 7,444 votes. This was enough to finish second among the six candidates running for the two "no residency" seats, but was only tenth in the overall Democratic Party Primary. Despite receiving more votes from the same electorate, Mr. Kinaka was eliminated and Mr. Morrow went on to the general election.

Mr. Kinaka's failure to advance to the general election despite receiving more votes than Mr. Morrow, appears to violate a strict reading of Section 12-41, Haw. Rev. Stat. which reads:

"(a) The person or persons receiving the greatest number of votes at the primary or special primary as a candidate of a party for an office shall be the candidate of the party at the following general or special general election..."

If Mr. Kinaka had protested, the County would surely have asserted that Mr. morrow and Mr. Kinaka were running in different races. However, in doing so the County must take the position that each of the subdistricts is a separate election district.

The assertion that the subdistricts are "separate" is contradicted by the fact that all of Maui's voters vote for all nine council members. Thus, Section 12-41, which embodies the principal that the person with the most votes wins, may have been violated.

I reviewed the reports of the past charter review commissions. They were aware of the Equal Protection issue which has been resolved in favor of subdistrict residency requirements (Fortson v Dorsey, Dusch v Davis and Dallas County v Reese). However, they don't appear to have considered Section 12-41, Haw. Rev. Stat.

If you and the Commissioners feel it would be helpful to amend Section 12-41 to explicitly authorize Maui's election subdistricts, please let me know. I'd like to be sure that someone will testify in favor of such a bill before introducing it.

Second Question: Subdistrict Durational Residency Requirement

Q. Does the 90 day subdistrict durational residency requirement violate the Equal Protection Clause?

Candidates are restricted, in choosing a subdistrict, by a further requirement that a candidate must have lived in the subdistrict for 90 days immediately prior to the filing of the nominations papers. There is another

requirement that all candidates must have been residents of Maui County for 90 days preceding the filing of nomination papers. I am not concerned about the "countywide" durational residency requirement.

Analysis

In determining whether a duration residency requirement violates the equal protection clause, courts "consider the facts and circumstances behind the law, the interests which the State claims to be protecting and the interests of those who are disadvantaged by the classification." Williams v Rhodes, 393 U.S. 23, 89 S. Ct. 5, 21 L. Ed. 2d 24 (1968). See also Dunn v Blumstein, 405 U.S. 330, 335, 92 S. Ct. 995, 999, 31 L. Ed. 2d 274 (1972).

The usual "state interests" supporting durational residency requirements for candidates are: "first, to ensure that the candidate is familiar with his (or her) constituency; second, to ensure that the voters have been thoroughly exposed to the candidate; and third, to prevent political carpetbagging." (emphasis added) Sununu v Stark, 383 F. Supp. 1287 (1974). See also Chimento v Stark, supra. Perhaps a parallel interest would be found in a non-electoral subdistrict residency requirement, but it might be given even less weight than an electoral district residency requirement.

In <u>Chimento</u>, supra. at 1215, the Court upheld a seven year gubernatorial electoral district residency requirement. However, the Court noted that there were "lesser but nonetheless important offices that a putative Governor might well fill during the waiting period with benefit to his own political career and the people of the state..." and that the "rationale asserted by the state for such a residency requirement carries greater weight than if it applied to candidacies for lesser public offices." The Court put great emphasis on the fact that the residency requirement was a constitutional requirement of long standing and applied to only the high offices of Governor and Senator.

More analogous to the Maui situation is <u>Billington v</u>

<u>Hayduk</u> 439 F. Supp. 975 (1977) which concerned a five year residency requirement for candidates seeking the equivalent of maui's mayoral office. The Court in <u>Billington</u> distinguished <u>Chimento</u> by noting the absence of a constitutional foundation and the fact that the limit was being applied to a "lesser public office."

The <u>Billington</u> Court acknowledged a compelling interest, but using a strict scrutiny analysis, found the breath of the requirement was not tailored to government's legitimate objective. The Court, at 979, found that: "A purported candidate clearly could accomplish these ends not only in a shorter period of time but <u>also without county residence</u>." (emphasis added)

In a pertinent parallel to the situation on Maui, the Billington Court noted "...the County of Westchester is part of the megalopolis surrounding New York City. Plaintiff was a resident of the City of New York for a period prior to the time he moved to Westchester. The problems of Westchester have been displayed and discussed in the media so much that an individual, such as plaintiff, not residing within the county for the overly-broad period of five years, but residing within New York City, would have knowledge thereof."

The <u>Billington</u> reasoning could apply in the case of Maui's pre-filing subdistrict residency requirement. A lifetime Maui resident is still required to establish residency in a non-elector subdistrict, three month before filing. Even if the county's interest were compelling, it may be satisfied by the parallel 90 day county residency requirement, which applies to all candidates, and a requirement of residence from the date of the election.

A second concern is with the fundamental right to relocate within the county of Maui without suffering undue burdens. This right to travel/relocate is always enough to strike down voter residency requirements, see Dunn v Blumstein, supra. and has also been used to require strict scrutiny for durational residency requirements for candidates. In Wellford v Battaglia, 343 F. Supp. 143, 148 (1972) a five year residency requirement for mayoral candidates was found to "penalize those persons and only those persons who have recently exercised their constitutional right of migration. For this reason alone it must meet the compelling interest test."

A third aspect is the separate interest of the voters to have the widest possible number of candidates to chose from. In Chimento, supra. at 1216, the Court found that his burden on the voter was "more hypothetical than real." However, in Wellford, supra., it was given more weight.

Citing Harper v Virginia Board of Elections, 383 U.S. 663, 86 S. Ct. 1079, 16 L. Ed. 2d 169 (1966), Harper v Union School District, 395 U.S. 621, 89 S. ct. 1886, 23 L. Ed. 2d 583 (1969) and Dunn, supra., the Court in Wellford noted that a "direct burden, however small, on the right to vote must clearly be subjected to the 'close scrutiny' of the compelling interest test." It found that the law was "an absolute barrier to the candidacy of a not insubstantial segment of the community" and struck it, inter alia, on that ground under the strict scrutiny standard. It is not clear, factually, what percentage of the population of Maui moves interstate, intrastate and intracounty during a 90 day period. However, it could easily be a legally substantial percentage.

Either candidate interests or voter interests could challenge the county's interest in a pre-filing subdistrict residency requirement. This is especially true where the subdistrict residency requirement is in addition to an equal duration "countywide" residency requirement and pertains to a non-electoral subdistrict.

My research hasn't been exhaustive, but there seems to be enough to warrant this letter to you. I discussed this with Guy Haywood on Monday, so as a courtesy I'm sending him a copy of this letter.

Dear Mr. Nakasone and Members of the Commission,

I read with great interest recent newspaper articles about your review of Maui County's Charter. While there are certainly many innovative suggestions being considered, I should like to offer an old idea.

Sub-units of government within a county are not uncommon on the Mainland and in other countries. Townships, in particular, have much to offer in terms of solving some of the problems Moloka'i encounters. Township units could also resolve some of the problems inherent in unique lifestyles island-to-island within Maui County, and even on the Island of Maui alone

Hana, Lahaina, Lanai, Moloka'i each as their own township within the county could be eligible for separate and additional federal, state and private funds, primarily because of their unique make-up. This sort of solution could reduce the revenue distribution burden for county-wide programs, absorbing some of the CIP costs as well as training and manpower development costs.

Maui County faces a tremendous financial burden in the next few years as remedial infra-structure needs are met. Establishing some of the poorest areas, the most needy areas, and the most politically sensitive areas as townships in their own right could greatly reduce that burden for the County as a whole.

Much information about townships has been researched and applications for Moloka'i already explored. If you have any interest in pursuing this solution, please let me know, and I'll help if I can.

Sorry this is a bit late in the process, but we live half the year in Wailau Valley on Moloka'i's north shore: no phone, no paper, no mail, etc. This is my first opportunity to comment. Thanks for your time.





I. Call to Order

Chairman Nakasone called the meeting to order at 4:20 p.m., on July 18, 1991, in the Mayor's Lounge of the County building. He noted a quorum was present.

The Chair amended the agenda to add Communication 91-10, a July 9, 1991, letter from the County Clerk to the Commission and Communication 91-11, the proposal of the 1983 reapportionment committee. Also added was Communication 91-0, the Maui County Charter, 1989 edition.

II. Approval of July 3, 1991, Minutes

The minutes of the July 3, 1991, meeting were approved as circulated.

III. Communications

Communications 91-0 through 91-11 were accepted.

IV. Budget

Communication No. 91-2, 7/11/91 letter from the Mayor regarding the budget of the previous commission, was discussed. As the letter stated, the type of information requested was not

available. Therefore, a subcommittee of three people will be formed, chaired by Anne Takabuki. The subcommittee will submit a proposed budget to the commission at the next meeting.

V. <u>Timetable</u>

Corporation Counsel was asked to submit a timetable as to the process of submitting proposed amendments to the Charter. The Chair asked Mr. Haywood to clarify Article 14, Section 14.3, Mandatory Review, of the Maui County Charter, specifically relating to "forty-five days" before any election. The Chair reported he interpreted that as being the primary election.

Mr. Haywood noted that Section 14-3 states "The commission may propose amendments to this charter. . . within fifteen (15) months after such commission has been appointed." He was not sure of how the appointment process went. He will look into the date there was a quorum.

The Chair requested from Corporation Counsel an absolute final date for filing the proposed amendments with the Clerk's office, taking into account the above-mentioned forty-five days. The Chair noted we would not be working with the "fifteen months" because time is already short.

Dates of public hearings and publication dates in the newspapers would also be part of the process and should be included in the timetable.

A. Sunshine Law

The Chair then asked Corporation Counsel to briefly give the commission the guidelines of the Sunshine Law (Communication No.91-4, Chapter 92 of the <u>Hawaii Revised Statutes</u>). Mr. Haywood noted the important thing about Chapter 92 is its intention to protect any individual's right to know.

He noted a "chance meeting" is a social, informal grouping of two or more members where business is not discussed; a "meeting" is any gathering of members where business is discussed. All meetings are open to the public and the public is given the opportunity to speak. The board is allowed to limit the time of the public's comments. Executive sessions allow a board to conduct business without the public present.

A board must give six days notice to the Clerk's office of any agenda. Public hearings must be published, according to the law, in a newspaper published at least twice weekly in the County.

After asking if there were any more questions, and there being none, Mr. Haywood excused himself from the meeting.

VI. Other Business

A. Public Testimony

It was noted that at all meetings the public will be free to testify. Future agendas will so note this by placing another item on the agenda, "Public Testimony".

B. <u>Legal/Clerical Support</u>

The Chair noted Allan Sparks' recommendation that the commission obtain an executive secretary with some legal experience. A subcommittee of three people will be formed, chaired by Sherrilee Dodson, to submit guidelines to the commission at the next meeting, about the contracting of these two individuals.

C. Post Office Box

Sherrilee Dodson did obtain a post office box for the commission. The new box number is 307, Kahului, 96732. Ms. Dodson will ask Pamela Dodson, Information Officer in the office of the Mayor, to do a press release on where the Charter Commission will receive its mail.

[At this time guest Herman Adalist departed from the meeting. Before leaving he commended the commission members for committing to this purpose and wished them well.]

VII. Next Meeting Date

The Chair advised he had contacted Council Services about the use of its committee room for future meetings. The room has a good sound system with many microphones. Eventually, when more formal matters are acted upon and/or when minutes might be critical, the tapes will be accessible, of good quality and of great help. There were no objections to this suggestion.

The Chair then recommended that the next meeting be subject to the call of the Chair. Ms. Fabrao announced second Thursdays are good days for her. Mr. Cockett advised he would not be able to make a meeting on the last Thursday of the month. There were no objections to the next meeting being on call.

VIII. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 4:50 p.m.

FY 1992 PROPOSED BUDGET

Chairman Nakasone and Members:

Commission Members Lloyd Yonenaka, Anne Takabuki and Dolores Fabrao met on July 18, 1991 to review Communication 91-2 from Mayor Linda Crockett Lingle and to discuss and formulate a proposed budget for the 1991-1992 Charter Commission activities.

Mayor Crockett Lingle indicated that no details were available as to the prior Charter Commission's expenditures. However, she did indicate that the prior Commission spent approximately \$58,216 (\$36,300 + \$21,616) of the total of \$70,000 which was appropriated in FY 1982 and FY 1983.

It was our general conclusion that, given the increase in costs over the passage of nearly ten years, the \$50,000 appropriated will not be sufficient for the Commission's operations. However, it is our recommendation that we inform the Mayor and the Council that it is the Commission's intention to stay within the \$50,000 for the current fiscal year period. If additional expenses are incurred, it may be possible to request an additional appropriation for FY 1993, and pay these expenses in July 1992. We should also advise the Mayor and the Council that we will monitor our expenditures and apprise them in advance (e.g., January 1993) of any anticipated need for a supplemental appropriation in FY 1993.

The attachment summarizes our estimates of the funding required for various operating items.

Your review and suggestions regarding the attached proposal are requested.

I. WELCOME

Mayor Linda Crockett Lingle welcomed the members and thanked them for serving on this important Commission. Press that were present were acknowledged. The Mayor advised Commission members to expect to have press at their meetings. Marylou Green was introduced by the Mayor as the support person until the Commission decides on how they want to handle clerical support.

The Mayor advised members that they have a budget of \$50,000 to be used as they deem necessary; e.g., part-time secretarial support, legal support, public relations support.

The Mayor informed members that she will always be available to them for any questions or concerns they may have during the course of their commission.

Member Al Sparks asked if it would be possible to obtain more than the budgeted \$50,000. The Mayor said it would be possible, with an amended budget, that must be approved by County Council.

A question was raised as to meeting places. The Mayor advised that other than the Mayor's lounge, they are welcome to use any of the other County conference rooms, such as Civil Defense or Planning.

Member Robert Nakasone requested information from the prior Commission, especially relating to its budget. The Mayor will attempt to get this information.

It was brought up that the \$50,000 would also be used for travel/per diem. It was suggested that a budget be worked on soon so it can be presented to County Council as soon as possible.

Financial disclosure statements will be mailed to all members.

Being that there were no further questions or concerns from the members, the Mayor again extended her best wishes, expressed her appreciation, and excused herself.

II. <u>INTRODUCTION</u> OF MEMBERS

Each member introduced him/herself to the group and gave a brief personal history.

III. SELECTION OF COMMISSION CHAIRMAN AND VICE CHAIRMAN

After some discussion it was moved by Ms. Dodson that Robert Nakasone be nominated as Chairman. The motion was seconded and carried.

Mr. Nakasone moved that Sherrilee Dodson be nominated as Vice Chairman. The motion was seconded and carried.

IV. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

A. <u>Distribution of Information to Members</u>

Chairman Nakasone requested the Commission be mailed, prior to their next meeting, former Commission reports, budgets, and other County Charters. Ms. Dodson has the County Charter from San Diego and will distribute it to all members. Mr. Sparks advised he has a model city charter and will distribute it to all members.

B. <u>Meeting Place</u>, Telephone Number

Discussion was had regarding permanent space and obtaining a telephone number. No decision was made. This may be taken up at a later time.

Discussion was had regarding the meeting place and having it in a County office. The Charter states ". . . shall be held in county building or other publicly owned place." It was therefore decided it would be acceptable to hold meetings at a school or other public facility, even though not County-owned.

C. Charter Revision Suggestions from the Public

Mr. Reyes inquired as to how to handle inquiries from individuals or organizations personally known to each commission member. The Commission agreed it would be acceptable to listen to any suggested revisions and to advise people to submit their ideas in writing.

D. <u>Incoming Mail</u>

It was suggested the Commission obtain a post office box. It was agreed Vice-Chair Dodson would check if the Kahului Post Office had boxes available. She goes there daily and would be able to check the Commission's mail.

V. ANNOUNCEMENT OF NEXT MEETING

The next meeting will be held on Thursday, July 18, 1991, at 4:00 p.m., in the Mayor's lounge.

At the next meeting the budget and a timetable will be prepared.

VI. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 5:30 p.m.
